2022 Scholarship and Awards of Excellence

The RPNF proudly celebrates the accomplishments of Registered Psychiatric Nurses, and Psychiatric Nursing students. This year, the RPNF is disbursing \$2,000 in scholarships and is awarding two Awards of Psychiatric Nursing Excellence in the area of Clinical Practice and two Gold Medals of Excellence to graduating students of the Brandon University B.Sc.P.N. program.

Scholarships are awarded to students of Psychiatric Nursing and Registered Psychiatric Nurses who have met specified criteria and are enrolled in approved and appropriate under-graduate, or graduate education programs which advance the profession of psychiatric nursing.

John Kellie Scholarship

For the past 4 years, Amber Lynes has worked as a respite worker with individuals who experience intellectual and physical disabilities, honing relationship-building skills and focusing on interventions supporting individuals to thrive in their daily lives. She also volunteers at the Clubhouse in Winnipeg, engaging in mental health rehabilitation interventions. Ms. Lynes' work in these areas contributes directly to her future career as a psychiatric nurse. Ms. Lynes' goal is to work in the addictions field, assisting individuals dealing with substance use disorders, and she would like to be a part of developing the required supports and services.

Riley Hammond's work history includes facilitating programs at the John Howard Society of Brandon at the Men's Resource Centre where services support individuals experiencing social health challenges in the community. He also works as a research assistant for the Centre for Critical Studies of Rural Mental Health and the Faculty of Health Studies, and serves as Vice-President with the Brandon University Health Studies Students Association. Mr. Hammond's psychiatric nursing career goals include advocating for, and implementation of a supervised injection site in Manitoba, practicing mental health nursing in a forensic assertive community treatment context, pursuing graduate studies in public health with specialization in health policy and global health, and striving to support health equity for marginalized populations.

John Alex Crawford Graduate Scholarship

Kayla Webb's research explores experiences in foundational psychiatric nursing education that RPN's have found to be meaningful in managing their personal and emotional response to trauma in the clinical setting. Through the identification of experiences that aid in the emotional management of exposure to traumatic experiences, Ms. Webb believes that more efficacious preventative measures can be integrated into undergraduate nursing education, indirectly promoting higher quality patient care and improving the quality of life of mental health nurses. It is hoped that curriculum content and training can be identified to assist psychiatric nurses to effectively manage personal and emotional responses to trauma experienced through practice.

The RPNF also offers the following Scholarships, noting that this year there were not qualified applicants.

McCormick-Henry National Scholarship - \$1000: Awarded to a Registered Psychiatric Nurse in Canada who is taking further studies in seniors' mental health at a masters or doctoral level or through an accredited certificate program.

Marlene Fitzsimmons Scholarship - \$500: Awarded to a RPN registered in Manitoba who is enrolled in a relevant certificate course or, who is presenting a paper at a local, national or international conference.

Kay Armstrong Scholarship - \$500: Awarded to a 4th year student in the baccalaureate program at Brandon University, with a GPA of 3.0:

Alf Barnett Scholarship - \$1000: Awarded to a Registered Psychiatric Nurse in Manitoba pursuing Masters or Doctoral Studies.

Award of Excellence-Clinical
